

ACTIVITY INSTRUCTIONS

SOUND profile



RECORDING AND EDITING

Students make an individual sound profile. They reflect on their favourite sounds, the sound associated with their home and hobbies. They choose five sounds.

They record these sounds (or 'make' these sounds) on their smartphone or any other recording device.

They upload these sounds on the computer in order to make a sequence: sound 1-5 after one another. They export this sequence in one (1) soundfile (preferably mp3). You can use 'Audacity' or any other software to place these sounds in one sequence.

They save this sound file under a name. The three first characters refer to your town or city, then a hyphen, then your name)

e.g. WAR-LucDesplenter.mp3 (WAR = Waregem)

WRITTEN PROFILE

Students write a text introducing themselves and explaining the sounds in their sound profile.

They save this document as a text file. Using the same name as the sound file

e.g. WAR-LucDesplenter.docx

OUTPUT

- A soundfile (mp3)
- A text file

Minimum six students make an individual soundfile. More is also possible
